In addition to the owners attending and represented, the meeting was attended by the Meridional Team, Lisa Grajales as translator, Hanan Rihab as transcriber, Javier Ortiz as lawyer and registered administrator and Domingo Ariza as director of Meridional.

Although Meridional brings their translator to assist the members of the community at the meeting, the president has hired the services of a translator Mr. Alberto López on his own and without prior notice. Therefore the aforementioned professional will act as Spanish-English translator.

AGENDA:

1) - APPROVAL, IF APPROPRIATE, OF THE CHANGE OF SECRETARY-ADMINISTRATOR OF THE COMMUNITY.

Establece el artículo 16.1 de la Ley de Propiedad Horizontal que la comunidad puede celebrar dos tipos de asambleas

All the owners present at the assembly have been identified and the meeting can therefore begin.

The Secretary - Administrator, Mr. Domingo Ariza, opens the session, apologising to all those present for the delay as he has had to count all the proxy votes that were not delivered prior to the meeting and that have had to be registered in the system.

There were 14 owners attending the meeting with a coefficient of 5.594% and 98 represented with a total of 42.634% of the coefficient. In total the meeting is made up of 112 owners with 48,228 % of the coefficient.

10 of the represented owners and one of those present have debts, therefore they have no voting rights. The list of outstanding debts as of 13/01/2022, taking as a reference date the community charges up to 31/12/2021, is marked in the attendance tables of the minutes and is attached as an annex to the same.

All attendees are advised that the meeting will be recorded, and no one objects.

Mr. Ariza opens the meeting, giving the floor to Mr. Riley as President, who welcomes all the participants and explains the point on the agenda, which is the change of Administrator of the community. He clarifies that he is going to request the vote of those present on the change of Administrator, but beforehand he allows a round of questions to resolve any doubts. Nobody asks any questions, so Mr. Ariza takes the floor to explain that the lawyer, Mr. Javier Ortiz is going to read some legal warnings to be taken into account for the holding of the meeting.

Mr. Ortiz takes the floor and reads the following text to all present:

Article 16.1 of the Horizontal Property Law establishes that the community can hold two types of meetings:

- a) Ordinary meetings, which must be held once a year, and at which at least the budgets and accounts of the community must be submitted for approval, and other usual community business, such as the annual appointment of officers, settlement of arrears and approval of the previous minutes.
- b) Extraordinary meetings, which may be held at any time, and at which any other community business may be discussed.

The deadlines for convening both are as follows:

Ordinary meetings must be held with at least 6 days' notice, while extraordinary meetings do not require this minimum period, as it is enough for them to be held sufficiently in advance for all the owners to be aware of them.

And this is where I understand that the community may have problems and this is the reason why it has been advised to set a date that not only allows the owners to be aware of the meeting but also allows the owners who wish to attend to do so.

This would prevent owners who have not been able to attend or have knowledge of the meeting from challenging the resolutions adopted and initiating a long and costly legal procedure with unpredictable consequences for some.

But also bear in mind that by law the meeting that must be held every year is the ordinary meeting and this meeting should have been held in August and therefore it is the meeting that should be convened in principle, giving all owners the possibility of being informed of the accounts, approving budgets and renewing all the positions.

And if Meridional ceases to be the administrator, it does so having submitted the accounts of its management, which it is being prevented from doing at the moment if it is finally decided to replace them.

Remember that the summons for extraordinary meetings do not have a deadline, but they do have to comply with certain considerations.

And what I am setting out below is not from me, it is extracted from the book by Mr. Carlos Gallego Brizuela and has been provided to me by the Illustrious Territorial College of Property Administrators of Malaga and Melilla to which all administrators must belong:

"The application of this rule must be based on the specific circumstances of each case, without its generic nature serving to cover up ways of failing to comply with the legal obligation: the resolution of an urgent matter (for example, the replacement of a costly part of the heating system in times of intense cold) which reasonably requires immediate agreement, cannot be treated in the same way as the adoption of agreements on matters whose solution can be left for a later time. That is why an unnecessarily hasty summons that prevents a member of the community from attending the meeting will entitle him/her to challenge the decision in court".

For all these reasons I would ask you to postpone this meeting, specify and agree today the date for the holding of the Ordinary General Meeting which must be held every year where accounts can be presented and positions can be renewed allowing all owners to attend and express themselves on all matters of the community, only in this way problems will be avoided and your community and its president will be strengthened.

This would prevent owners who have not been able to attend or have knowledge of the meeting from challenging the resolutions adopted and initiating lengthy and costly legal proceedings with unpredictable consequences for the community.

Mr. Ortiz mentions that the community has an agreement signed by the president with ALGABAMAR for which the community should receive 20.000€ and that this is an item that would be included in the agenda of the AGM, thus fulfilling what was stipulated in the agreement and the community would receive the amount owed.

The president takes the floor thanking Mr. Ortiz for his words, and mentions that it was not possible to convene an AGM in July 2021 as he was in hospital for COVID.

At this point Mr. Ariza asks for a clarification explaining in more detail the matter of ALGABAMAR but the president does not give him the floor and goes on to say that due to legal advice, it was not possible to convene an AGM due to the pandemic, and that if he had been able to hold a meeting during 2021, the agenda would have been the same as today and that he had to wait until 31 December 2021 for the restrictions to end and thus be able to convene an Extraordinary Meeting; that he would have preferred to hold this meeting in October or November and that he is holding it now as he fears that there will be restrictions on meetings again. He also says that an attempt was made to convene a virtual meeting but he was advised not to convene it as it might not be legally valid.

At this point, the lawyer wants to clarify that this meeting that is being held should have been an AGM instead of an EGM.

Mr. Ariza takes the opportunity to explain at the request of Mr. Ezequiel Alonso that Algabamar is the builder of the urbanisation that had a debt with the community of owners for years and with whom agreements were signed for the payment of this debt. Algabamar settled the debt by paying half of an initial amount of 40.000€ and the payment of the rest of the debt was pending, subject to an agreement that had to be ratified at the next General Meeting and included in the agenda, so it should have been included in the agenda of this meeting, because it is something that is signed in the agreement.

Mr. Ariza also clarifies that it was indeed recommended to the president that virtual informative meetings could be held as has been done in other communities of owners and not AGM as virtual meetings are not legally well regulated, and that in August it was agreed to convene a meeting in November, all documents and reports were sent to the president, but without response until today's meeting.

He also clarified that the meetings were not forbidden, but that it was recommended that they not be held, and for this reason virtual informative meetings were suggested.

The president took the floor to say that in his opinion the risk was too great; in the community there are very big issues to be dealt with and very important decisions to be taken and big challenges for which exhaustively legal meetings have to be held to take those decisions and that is why in his opinion and due to the legal advice he received, he decided not to convene those meetings to date. That these meetings will be convened in time and with greater attendance of owners where all the questions that arise can be answered with other administrators who will give the best possible advice to the community, but that today the business of the day is different. He stated that he wants to move forward with the affairs of the community and that is why he wants to gather the votes to materialise the change and create the team that can carry out the progress.

An owner asks how many votes are needed to change the administrator, and the president replies that a simple majority is required.

A quick count is made of the votes available, and 101 properties are represented, of which the president has 64 votes in his favour, so he already has a simple majority.

However, Mr. Ariza states that, although the result of the vote is clear, he wants to convey the concerns expressed by the 22 owners who have asked him to represent them through their vote.

At this point, Mrs. Iva G. Drazheva (Mezquita 1, 3ºD) takes the floor to say that depending on the decision taken today, the budgets, contracts and agreements of the community will be affected and that she would like to have more information in order to be able to vote rationally rather than emotionally on the change of administrator.

Another owner says that enough information was sent out some time ago to make decisions, but Ms. Drazheva insists that this information does not provide information about the financial future of the community, which is what she is concerned about. She insists that she needs to know how the change of administrator will affect her pocket in order to be able to vote.

The President replied that they were moving away from the point of the day and clarified that he had sent 2 detailed reports with a vision for the future. If this vision is approved, it will be monetised and can be endorsed at the next AGM. But that he cannot now provide detailed information on matters that will have to be analysed in detail by qualified people and that we are here today to vote on those people.

Ms. Drazheva insists that just a vision is not enough, that she needs figures to which the President tells her that he regrets it and that if the majority agrees she will have to accept what the majority decides.

The president goes on to add that the new administrator will cost half the current one, and reminds again that the reason for the meeting is the change of administrator and not the state of the accounts of the community.

Mr. Ezequiel Alonso comments that it does not matter what is said at any meeting, as if the president has 64 votes, what he wants will always be done.

Mr. Per Nyberg (Mezquita 5, 4º1) took the floor to say that he has to leave the meeting shortly but that if the President has 64 votes, it is not because they belong to him but because they are owners who agree with him and have delegated their vote to him after seeing his vision for the community of owners and agreeing with it. Mr. Nyberg also points out that the president was right not to call the AGM following the recommendations that were made against the meetings, and finally adds that, in his opinion, the change of administrator does not imply that the agreement signed with ALGABAMAR will not be fulfilled.

Mr. Ariza comments that one of the clauses of the agreement with ALGABAMAR was that it would be ratified at the next AGM or EGM, and that his obligation is to report that the agreement is not being complied with, but not that it will not be carried out.

The President proposes to move on to the vote on the agenda item and to be able to continue talking about any other community issues afterwards.

Mr. Ariza takes the floor to point out that his representatives have expressed their dissatisfaction with this matter and that they are not happy with the way this meeting has been organised and feel that their interests are not being defended and that they wish to put on record that they reserve their vote to challenge these agreements that

are taken here. On the other hand, he would like to read a letter on behalf of Meridional Team:

Dear owners:

Meridional is the secretary administrator for all the community members, for the more than 300 with their more than 800 properties and it is our duty to administer for all, without exception, without preferences, without favouritism, without attending to pressures. All the community members are equal for us.

This is undoubtedly an anomalous meeting. The logical and usual thing to do is to be able to present accounts and inform the owners of everything that has been worked on during this time.

On the other hand, many owners have been denied the opportunity to attend, and have expressed their surprise and anger. In August in a meeting with the president and vice-president it was agreed to call a general meeting in November and to do so with a broad agenda, despite our requests we did not succeed in this. We do not know why this meeting was hastily convened and why only one item or why our proposal to hold it at a later date was not accepted.

Meridional is doing its job, has fulfilled the objectives to which it was committed, has been advising when necessary and has proposed actions to improve the community, and above all, is transparent in its accounts: every quarter the accounts have been reported to the president and vice-president, they have been discussed, they have been evaluated and there have been no major problems. We would have liked to have been able to show them calmly and in detail to the whole community, but today it is not on the agenda.

I also want to recognise that there have been mistakes, I know that, of course, there are things we can improve. Only those who work can make mistakes, and we have worked hard.

All my team: Alina, Lisa, Caterina, Javier, Paco and myself, have considered from day one that this community needs extra work and extra commitment, we do it and we maintain it, and that is why we have managed to change the bad trend of the community for so many years.

We also do not turn our back on any problem, whether it is a community problem or an owner's problem, not least because we do not want to, nor do we know how to ignore problems. The solutions we provide may not be the most popular, or what everyone would have liked, but we have always offered realistic solutions.

Like all administrators, Meridional is aware that all its work will be evaluated by the whole community at the General Meeting. It is normal to present accounts and a report of everything that has been done. Above all, to evaluate from where we started and where we are; then the owners can evaluate the management and if they are not satisfied, they can change the positions of the community, including the administrator if they consider it so.

If you hand over a car with damaged wheels, no steering wheel, broken windows, a faulty engine and an empty petrol tank; which also won't start and can't move and after more than a year the vehicle has a steering wheel, full tyres, the engine is not completely repaired, but it runs and the tank is full; to say that as it has broken windows and we haven't done anything I think is unfair at the very least, as well as untrue.

You handed over to us a community with many deficiencies, very high arrears and debts to suppliers and no money in the accounts, today you have a functioning community, many shortcomings have been corrected, significant amounts have been recovered, agreements have been reached with historical debtors, running costs have been reduced, suppliers are paid every month and the community's debt to them is being reduced, in short, there is a coherent administration.

There is much to be done, of course, but don't blame us if the windows are broken or the engine is not running at 100%. We have pumped up the tyres, put the steering wheel on and filled the tank, now they can move.

We received the community with just a few hundred euros in the accounts and at the end of January you will have in cash an amount close to 200,000 euros. This is objective data.

(During the reading of the document, the President tries to interrupt Mr. Ariza, but he insists that he represents 22 owners and that he must continue).

At this point, the President asks those present to vote for or against the change of administrator. The change would be from Meridional Team to Adenjo Gestión which is José Manuel Ortiz Sánchez. At that moment, Mr. Ezequiel Alonso interrupts to say that he knows Adenjo Gestión and that they are "chorizos (con artists)"; that there should be more options to study one of them and that he himself has properties in other communities where they do their management and that they have legal issues pending with them. That he (the president) should have brought 3 options to choose from and he brought the worst possible option. Adenjo Management are "chorizos" and hopes that he does not have any arrangement with them because what he brings is a disaster for the community.

Another owner tells the President that she is confused as in her email, John Riley mentioned 3 alternatives to Meridional Team in order to be able to choose one and yet today he only offers one alternative.

The Chairman clarifies that he is proposing Adenjo Gestión as a member of a 3-legged team and that he had already provided this information previously and goes on to explain that he has been working on this matter for months and that he has provided everyone with a document explaining the reasons for this change; that he is comfortable with his recommendation and that he is now asking everyone to vote.

At this point, Mr. Ariza states for the record that on behalf of the owners he represents, he asks that no vote be taken and that an AGM be called within the time period that the president deems appropriate and that the budgets of the administrators be brought to this meeting as deemed most appropriate, so that the process is transparent and not obscure.

The president thanks for the advice and goes on to ask those present to vote:

The President has 64 voting proxies from owners who exercise in favour of his proposal, not being able to exercise their right to vote because they are debtors.

The result of the vote is 2 abstentions, 23 votes against and 76 votes in favour of the change of administrator.
